JUDGMENT

Now comes, on this 17th Day of September, 2020, this cause of action having been submitted to the Court for Consideration upon the Complaint and exhibits filed herein the summons against the Defendant, MICHAEL VARNER, the return of service showing proper service for the time in the manner required by Arkansas law, the evidence introduced by the Plaintiff, SUSAN WEAVER, and other matters and proof, the Court finds as follows:
