MOTION FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT

Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 56, Defendants Caleb J. Miller¹, Nurse Daniel Burson, Nurse Angie L. Nachtigal, and Mercy Hospital Rogers d/b/a Mercy Hospital Northwest Arkansas (“Mercy Hospital”) (collectively “Defendants”) by and through their attorneys, Wright, Lindsey & Jennings LLP, move the Court to enter summary judgment in their favor on the complaint of plaintiff Coby Hurst (“Hurst”), and for grounds, states that no material facts are in dispute, and based on the undisputed material facts, Defendants are entitled to judgment as a matter of law. More specifically, Defendants state:

1. Plaintiff Coby Hurst has brought this Section 1983 lawsuit against numerous medical providers, arising from an Emergency Room visit at Mercy Hospital on June 9, 2019, whereby he alleges that his Fourth Amendment rights were

violated and he was “raped” due to the placement of a catheter for residual urine. Hurst claims damages of \$21 million.

2. It is undisputed that Hurst was brought to the Mercy Hospital ER via an ambulance and classified as a level 2 trauma with head pain, laceration to his head, and altered mental status. As part of Hurst’s medical care and treatment and evaluation, the ER physician, Dr. Mark Rucker, entered numerous orders, including laboratory studies, radiology studies, and an EKG. The urine drug screen was part of a host of laboratory studies to be run on Hurst. To accomplish this drug screen as ordered by the physician, Nurse Daniel Burson inserted an “intermittent” urethral catheter to obtain Hurst’s residual urine for testing. Hurst tested positive for cannabinoids, methamphetamine, amphetamine, and benzodiazepine. The ER physician, Dr. Mark Rucker, gave Hurst a primary diagnosis of methamphetamine abuse and discharged him in stable condition.

3. The claims against Defendants must be dismissed with prejudice for numerous reasons, any one of which alone is sufficient to warrant dismissal.

4. First, Hurst failed to exhaust his administrative remedies as required under the Prison Litigation Reform Act.

5. Second, the Defendants were not state actors and were thus not acting under the “color of law;” there can be no constitutional violation by Defendants. Even if the Defendants were considered to be acting under the color of law, the Defendants would be entitled to qualified immunity.

6. Third, there was no unreasonable search and seizure under the Fourth Amendment.

7. Fourth, rape is not a recognized or cognizable civil claim in this instance.

8. Fifth, assuming *arguendo* that Plaintiff has made an Eighth Amendment claim, which he has not, Plaintiff's claims do not meet the required "deliberate indifference" threshold for a Section 1983 claim.

9. Sixth, Plaintiff has failed to show a physical injury or sexual act as required to sustain a Section 1983 claim.

10. In addition, Plaintiff has admitted that he did not intend to sue Mercy Hospital, Caleb Miller, and Nurse Angie Nachtigal, as none of them were the individuals who placed the catheter or ordered the catheter placement. Therefore, these defendants should be dismissed.

11. The Court should enter summary judgment in Defendants' favor in accordance with Fed. R. Civ. P. 56 for the reasons set forth above.

WHEREFORE, Defendants pray that its motion for summary judgment be granted, that the Court dismiss Plaintiff's Complaint against them with prejudice, for their costs herein expended, and for all other proper relief.

ON BEHALF OF DEFENDANTS DR. CALEB MILLER, NURSE DANIEL BURSON AND NURSE ANGIE L. NACHTIGAL:
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1 Q. When you take meth, what does it do to you?

2 A. Well, I mean, it helps to have -- work on your house and
3 fix it, but then those hopes obviously get wishy-washed up and
4 get reversed and you probably damage your house sometimes,
5 whatever.

6 Q. How many times do you think you had taken meth before
7 June 2019?

8 A. Well, I mean, there was a period of time, years before,
9 when I could handle meth and not go crazy, and I did it every
10 day for, like, six months straight.

11 Q. Now, what about this meth that's been laced with PCP and
12 Oxy -- is it OxyContin?

13 A. Yes. That's what it showed.

14 Q. And that was the meth that you were on in June of 2019;
15 right.

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. What effects did that meth that was laced with PCP and
18 OxyContin have on you?

19 A. Well, I mean, obviously, it heightened my awareness to
20 want to go beat up the neighbor kid who sabotaged my racecar
21 engine and I went over and knocked on his door and he wouldn't
22 come outside, and called police. And that's what got it in
23 there, which -- this was after the concussion. I should have
24 never done the drugs after the concussion. It was the first
25 time I did the drugs -- the 6/9/19 is the first time I used

1 meth since before 4/19.

2 Q. So on 4 -- in April of 2019, you had a concussion?

3 A. Yes. But I was not on meth that day. But two weeks
4 before that, I had used meth. I had quit using meth and trying
5 to get better, but the water was poisoning me at my house, and
6 I was thinking I was getting better and trying to flush my
7 system and drinking water that was poisoned and it -- no
8 bullshit, that's what wiped me out.

9 Q. So before June 9 of 2019, had you ever had any brain
10 damage?

11 A. They say that my brain is okay on the EKGs and stuff, and
12 they obviously checked me for a stroke, and there was no stroke
13 on 9/12 -- I mean, 6/9/19. There's evidence of your doctors
14 saying that I was not stroked, evidence of no stroke, and that
15 when they EKG'd my brain, that it was okay.

16 Q. So it's your understanding that an EKG was done on June 9?

17 A. I mean, not EKG. What's the head thing?

18 Q. CT -- CT scan?

19 A. CT scan.

20 Q. Yeah. But you weren't there for a stroke that day, were
21 you?

22 A. No. I was there -- the police brought me there.

23 Q. So would it be -- is this fair to say, that the chronic
24 use of meth has affected your attention, memory, and judgment?

25 A. No. I don't use it that often.

1 (Wherein a break was taken.)

2 Q. (Mr. Ritter continued.) All right. Mr. Hurst, we're back
3 on the record after a short break.

4 Have you done anything to prepare for your deposition
5 today?

6 A. I try not to. I mean, I prepared by trying not to want to
7 question you, how do you feel, representing rapeos [phonetic],
8 but it's not funny because it's real.

9 Q. What I meant by that, have you spoken to anybody to help
10 you prepare for your deposition?

11 A. No.

12 Q. Have you reviewed any documents to help you prepare for
13 your deposition today?

14 A. I did not.

15 Q. With respect to this lawsuit in general, have you reviewed
16 any documents?

17 A. Yes, I have. And that's how I come up with the names to
18 include into the lawsuit.

19 Q. So you've reviewed your medical records from the
20 hospital --

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. -- ER visit on June 19, 2019?

23 A. Yes. And, I mean, I don't want to exclude anybody that --
24 by just saying this, but I would like to state that -- I mean,
25 whoever is the one who stuck it in me, I don't exactly -- I'm

1 guessing it's -- I mean, I should know the name, but whoever
2 that one is, and the doctor ordering it should be the people on
3 the thing, but I wanted to make sure I got whoever did it. And
4 I -- there's several names involved in the day it happened, but
5 who is the one that stuck it in me?

6 Q. So you reviewed the hospital records --

7 A. Daniel -- Daniel something, I believe, is probably the one
8 who did it, is what it's looking like on the paperwork.

9 Q. So it's my understanding that you've named multiple people
10 in this lawsuit after looking at the hospital records?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. And really, your lawsuit is really only against the doctor
13 and the person that actually stuck the catheter in you?

14 A. Right. Because the other people didn't stick a catheter
15 in me.

16 Q. So it would be fair to say that you only intend for your
17 lawsuit to be against the doctor and the individual that
18 catheterized you?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. And you had named other people because you looked at the
21 records and couldn't figure out who exactly did it?

22 A. Yes. And that will help you, but I don't mind helping you
23 because --

24 Q. So you've got to understand, part of me asking these
25 questions, I'm trying to figure out what your lawsuit's about.

1 A. Right.

2 Q. And we're narrowing it down as to who you're actually
3 making claims against. Okay?

4 A. Right.

5 Q. And so the claims need to be against the doctor that
6 gave --

7 A. And I guess is it Daniel Burson? Is that the name who did
8 it to me? Because it says whoever took -- whoever took the
9 urine from me is the person who stuck it in me. And that's the
10 person -- you know, but I had to name them all because I don't
11 know exactly which -- what the paperwork is saying.

12 Q. That's the person you intend to sue?

13 A. Is he the one who stuck the catheter me?

14 Q. Well, I'm not here to answer the questions as to who did
15 what. And I'll be honest, I'm not a medical care provider and
16 I wasn't there.

17 A. Right.

18 Q. So --

19 A. I believe that's probably the name of the person who did
20 it, whoever got the specimen of the urine, but the way this
21 stuff is written, I'm not a medical expert so I can't be
22 perfect on what that was. So I named them all that was
23 involved in me that day.

24 Q. So have you spoken to any lawyers about this lawsuit?

25 A. No.

1 the drugs.

2 Q. How much drugs did you do?

3 A. A half a gram. And it was laced with PCP and OxyContin.

4 Q. Is that a lot of drugs?

5 A. To some people, no. No, it's not a lot of drugs. Some
6 people do a gram. I did a half a gram.

7 Q. How did you -- did you inject it?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. And when did you actually do the drugs? Did you do it
10 that morning on June 9?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Do you remember what time you did it?

13 A. Two hours before they did this to me.

14 Q. So around 8:00 a.m.?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. And did you do the drugs at your home?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. And that is located where?

19 A. At 520 East Spring Street.

20 Q. What happened after you did the drugs?

21 A. I got really hot and I took my clothes off, and I put --
22 put the clothes on like an Indian would tie it on. And when I
23 stepped out on the porch, they fell off.

24 Q. What you mean like an Indian would tie it on?

25 A. I tied my racing bicycle suit around where you couldn't

1 see my penis, and then when I took one step off the porch, it
2 fell off.

3 Q. Okay.

4 A. And being high on PCP and meth, not knowing I was on PCP,
5 but there was PCP in it -- I ran to the neighbor's house who
6 put a bolt down the carburetor of my Ford 98 stroker race
7 engine and ruined it over some debt that he never paid and was
8 mad at me, some kid who used to work for me --

9 Q. What was the kid's name?

10 A. Ben Cameron. So I went to his --

11 Q. So Ben -- well, tell me, what did Ben Cameron do to your
12 race car that you had in your garage?

13 A. He put a bolt down the motor that ruined the engine,
14 brand-new engine.

15 Q. So he ruined an engine in your race car?

16 A. Yes. A 498 stroker engine, very rare, \$3,000 just for the
17 crankshaft.

18 Q. Okay. So you go over to Cameron's house?

19 A. And knock on his door.

20 Q. Tell me what happens next.

21 A. I tell him to come outside, that he needs whooped, and he
22 won't come outside and then -- you really want to hear?

23 Q. Yeah, I want hear everything. It's my job today to get
24 all the details of that day.

25 A. Okay.

1 Q. So you go to his house. And when you say "He needs to get
2 whooped," you're going to go -- gonna beat some sense into him?

3 A. Yes. "Come outside. I want to beat you up." And he
4 wouldn't come outside.

5 Q. Okay. So what happened next?

6 A. Well -- okay. There was some dirty oil on the oil change
7 on the porch.

8 Q. Okay.

9 A. I take the oil to the neighbor's car and pour it on his
10 car because I thought God was going to flood the place -- and
11 I'm on PCP, remember -- I thought that it was not going to stop
12 raining and that the neighbor would be happy his car wouldn't
13 be rusted when the water went away -- that's what I really
14 thought -- and proceeded to pour dirty oil on the dude's car.

15 Q. What kind of car did he drive?

16 A. A Smart car, a red Smart car.

17 And then I poured some on his work van to make sure it
18 didn't rust too. And then I went over and got his German
19 Shepherd on the other side of the fence and was going to save
20 the German Shepherd, and it would not come over the fence with
21 me, and it was too heavy to pick up and take over there.

22 Then I saw the police car. Then I just saw a kiddie pool
23 in the backyard and decided that I was going to go swimming
24 before the cops arrested me. And I ran to this kiddie pool and
25 I dove in the kiddie pool with my chest flat on the ground with

1 my arms out flat in the give-up position, and the cop comes
2 around --

3 Q. Okay. Hold on. So whose yard are you in that has the
4 kiddie pool?

5 A. I am in a renter yard. I'm in a neighbor's house that is
6 a renter's.

7 Q. Do you recall that neighbor's name?

8 A. No. But there was the grandma and the two kids inside
9 this house, and I really wanted them as witnesses to the cop
10 hitting me.

11 Q. So you, at one time -- I guess you're hot or whatever?

12 A. Yes. From the --

13 Q. And so you decided to go get in their backyard and jump in
14 the kiddie pool in the backyard?

15 A. Yes. Yes.

16 Q. Okay. You're laying there, face down?

17 A. Face down.

18 Q. You're spread with your arms out?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. Okay. Tell me what happens next.

21 A. Then the cop comes around the corner, and he has handcuffs
22 on his hand like brass knuckles.

23 Q. Hold on. Why are the cops called?

24 A. I guess Ben called the police for me banging on his door.

25 Q. Is anybody outside --

1 A. Nobody.

2 Q. -- while you're in the kiddie pool?

3 A. Nobody.

4 Q. Okay. So the cop comes around. What happens?

5 A. He hits me three times in the head with handcuffs on, on
6 this bloody thing -- he hits me. I said, "Don't do that
7 again."

8 Q. Hold on. Because she can't get it down, when you say "on
9 this," the cop hit you on the bump on your head?

10 A. He hits me close to there, yeah.

11 Q. On the bump on your head?

12 A. I mean, he hits me in my head with handcuffs on.

13 Q. How many times?

14 A. Three times.

15 Q. You hurt? What happened?

16 A. I stood up and punched him in the jaw. The officer should
17 have put the handcuffs on me. I was laying there in the
18 give-up position like this, and he hit me three times in the
19 head.

20 Q. And when you say a "give-up" position, you mean on your
21 face with your hands behind you?

22 A. Yeah.

23 Q. Okay. So he hits you three times?

24 A. And I stood up and hit him in the jaw.

25 Q. You turn around and hit him in the jaw. What happens

1 next?

2 A. Then I took off running around the corner and I tried to
3 run through the fence, and it wouldn't -- I bounced back in the
4 cop's arms. And that was the end of it. He bear-hugged me
5 until the ambulance and other police came.

6 Q. Okay.

7 A. And then I was on my way to the forced catheterization.

8 Q. And do you remember who the officers were?

9 A. I do not. I remember he was really big, really big guy.

10 Q. Did you file any type of complaint or grievance against
11 the officer for punching you three times in the head?

12 A. No. But I -- I tried to tell the prosecutor that I would
13 take this to jury trial because the three people in the house
14 had to have been watching, and that I'll take it to jury trial,
15 and they'll wind up just giving me probation, time served, four
16 months. When -- instead of, you know, prison time for hitting
17 an officer because he hit me first, three times.

18 Q. So what was the outcome of that?

19 A. Six years probation, four months in the county jail, and I
20 served four months by the time court date came up.

21 Q. What types of injuries have you sustained from the officer
22 hitting you three times in the head?

23 A. None.

24 Q. Just pain at the time?

25 A. Yeah.

1 A. If that is the ER, I mean, that's the ER.

2 Q. So the medical personnel -- or somebody had asked that you
3 pee in some type of jug. Is that right?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. And was it your understanding they needed the pee to do a
6 urine analysis?

7 A. Ordered by the doctor.

8 Q. Okay. And you understood that that urinalysis was part of
9 the medical workup that they were doing on you?

10 A. No. Because I didn't sign for them to do any medical
11 workup on me at all.

12 Q. So from the moment you got to the hospital, is it your
13 testimony that you refused treatment?

14 A. I refused them sticking a catheter up me.

15 Q. Did you refuse being at the hospital that day?

16 A. No. I was strapped in the thing like -- I was wheeled in
17 there.

18 Q. At any point in time, did you tell the medical staff that
19 you didn't want to be treated at the hospital and for them to
20 discharge you?

21 A. They didn't ask. But I -- as soon as he said -- I really
22 didn't say -- I mean, when they asked me to pee in a cup and I
23 couldn't pee in a cup, I asked them to turn the water on. They
24 wouldn't turn the water on. And then when they started to --
25 they were going to do the catheter, I started screaming "no."

1 Q. Okay. So before we get to the catheter, it's your
2 understanding they needed the urine to be tested and analyzed
3 as part of their medical workup for you?

4 A. No. They don't need that because I told them I was on
5 drugs, and there was nothing wrong with me. Really, there was
6 nothing wrong with me other than what they seen in the head,
7 they didn't need to analyze anything out of my urine. No judge
8 told them to analyze my urine. No parole officer told them to
9 analyze my urine.

10 Q. And with respect to the officer, you mentioned there was
11 an officer that was present?

12 A. There was an officer.

13 Q. Did the officer have anything to do with the urine?

14 A. He tried to convince me to suck it up, it won't hurt that
15 long. That's what he said.

16 Q. Right. But the officer wasn't ordering the doctor or
17 nurses what to do?

18 A. To stick a catheter in me? No, he wasn't. But he was
19 trying to tell me just to -- it only hurts for a minute. It
20 only hurts for a minute. I'm like, "No. No. There's no way."

21 Q. And that's what I'm trying to get at. The medical people
22 were ordering the urine and doing the urine on their own free
23 will; right?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. The officer was not telling the nurses or the doctor to

1 order it?

2 A. Right. Right.

3 Q. Is that correct?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. Okay. So how many people are in the room as you are being
6 catheterized?

7 A. It was two for sure. It could have been three.

8 Q. Can you tell me who those two to three people were?

9 A. The officer and whoever was doing the catheter. But I
10 think there was -- I want to say that there was a male and
11 female medical worker in there and the officer, but it could've
12 been just one of them because they kept going in and out of the
13 room so much, sir. That's why I can't say that that -- that at
14 any given moment that there was three or only two perfectly
15 because they went in and out of that door a whole lot.

16 Q. Let's back up to the order for the urine.

17 Were you present when the doctor gave the order for the
18 urine?

19 A. Yes, I was.

20 Q. Who was in the room at the time?

21 A. And he turned around and walked out almost immediately.

22 Q. Do you remember the doctor's name?

23 A. The doctor -- I mean, from the paperwork or from that day,
24 him saying, Hi, I'm this doctor. It's been a long time.

25 Q. From that day, who was the doctor?

1 me three or four times; so, I mean, each time was different.
2 And I just know I was looking at my penis and not the face of
3 the person who was doing it and screaming, "No."

4 Q. So describe for me -- well, hold on. Strike that.

5 You told me it was one person that catheterized you?

6 A. Yeah. But there was somebody, I think, holding my legs.

7 Q. Who was holding your legs?

8 A. One of the two. There was a male and a female that was
9 in -- during that time, that -- other than the officer, and I
10 can't recall exactly who did it. I believe -- I really --
11 whoever did it, did it. They did it to me.

12 Q. So describe in detail the person who catheterized you.

13 A. That's -- that's impossible. I was looking at my dick,
14 screaming "No" and watching the tube go down in it and the
15 pain. I wasn't watching the person.

16 Q. Is it fair to say that you are not able to provide me a
17 description of the person who catheterized you?

18 A. At the moment, I mean -- if it was the girl, I couldn't
19 describe -- I mean, she was a nice-looking young lady, but I
20 couldn't even describe Daniel Burson the male, really,
21 because -- I mean, he wasn't Mexican. He wasn't -- he was a
22 white person. Both people were white people that were in the
23 room when it happened.

24 I mean, describing them as whatever -- but I was more
25 concerned with screaming -- I was more concerned with stopping

1 them, and I couldn't stop them. I was handcuffed to the damn
2 table. I was handcuffed down.

3 Q. What conversations did you have with these one or two
4 persons when you knew they were about to catheterize you?

5 A. I asked them to run the water so I could pee, and they
6 said they'd given enough time, and that they didn't give me any
7 time at all. They just said, "pee." They didn't give me no
8 time at all. They wouldn't run the water too. Whoever it was
9 wouldn't run the water.

10 Q. So what else was said before you were catheterized?

11 A. I probably was telling them that God would not like this
12 and then -- I mean, after it happened and the pain and
13 everything, I mean, I remember more about what I said after it
14 happened than trying to tell them to please run the water and
15 don't do this.

16 Q. As it's happening, how -- how do your pants get down?

17 A. I was trying to pee in the cup thing, in the jug -- excuse
18 me, a jug. I was up on my knees trying to pee in a jug, and
19 the officer wouldn't even unhandcuff me to the rail. I was
20 handcuffed to the rail. And I had -- I was trying to pee in
21 the cup. That's how -- I already had -- there was no pants, I
22 don't think so.

23 Q. I guess that would make sense.

24 So you didn't have any pants on when you --

25 A. No.

1 Q. Did they put a gown on you of some sort?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. That's something the hospital did; right?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. So tell me, as the catheter is being placed on you -- and
6 you told me you don't recall who it was that placed catheter.

7 Is that right?

8 A. Well, there was two of them. Like I said, there was two
9 of them, two health workers in there. All I remember is
10 saying, "No, don't do this," and going off on them.

11 And the officer trying to calm me down and saying, "It
12 will only hurt for a moment."

13 And I'm like, "No, hell no."

14 Q. So then what happened after that?

15 A. After they got the catheter in me -- and I was being as
16 still as possible because I knew it would be worse, and then
17 they got it out of me, I -- I said that "God is going to kill
18 all y'all. God is going to take China nuclear bombs and blow


